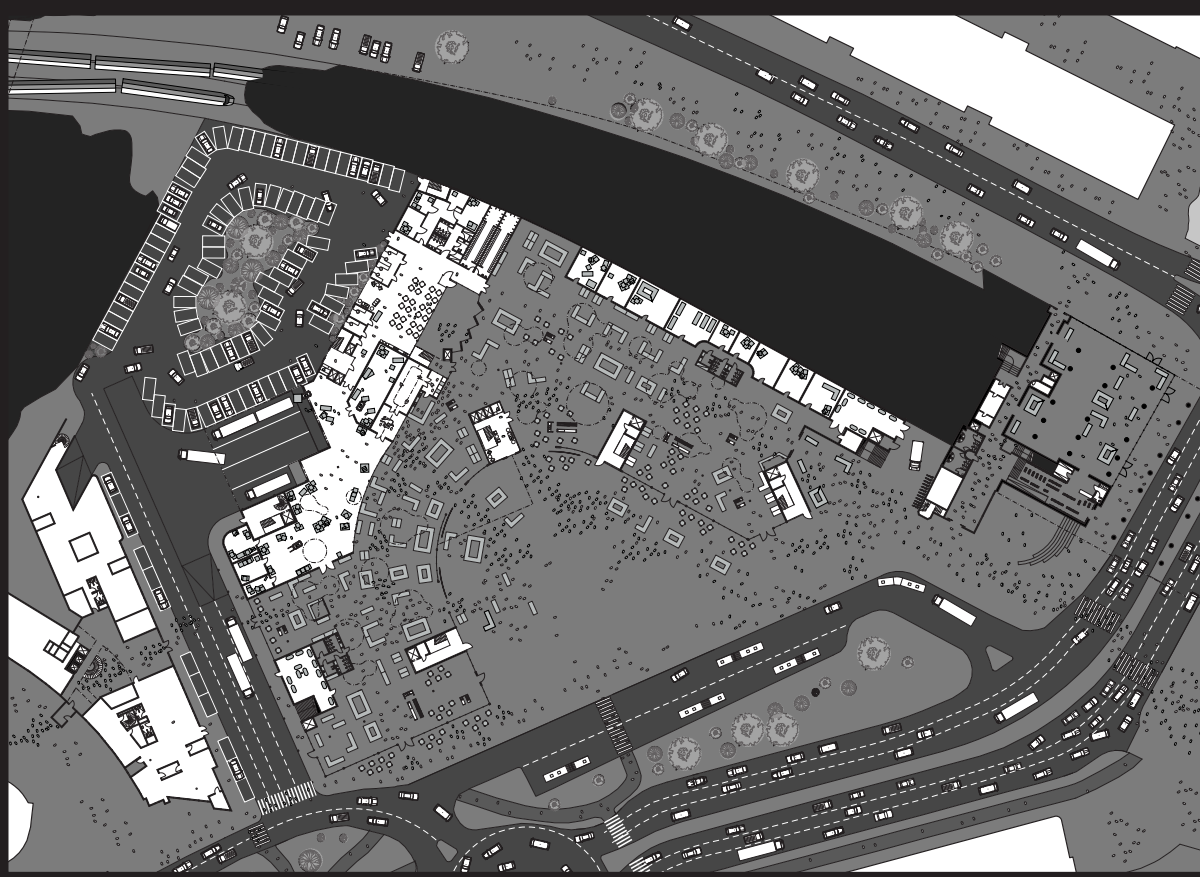
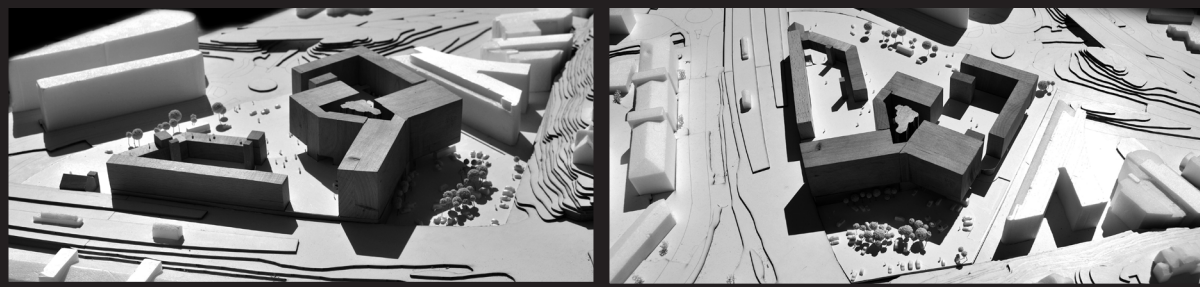
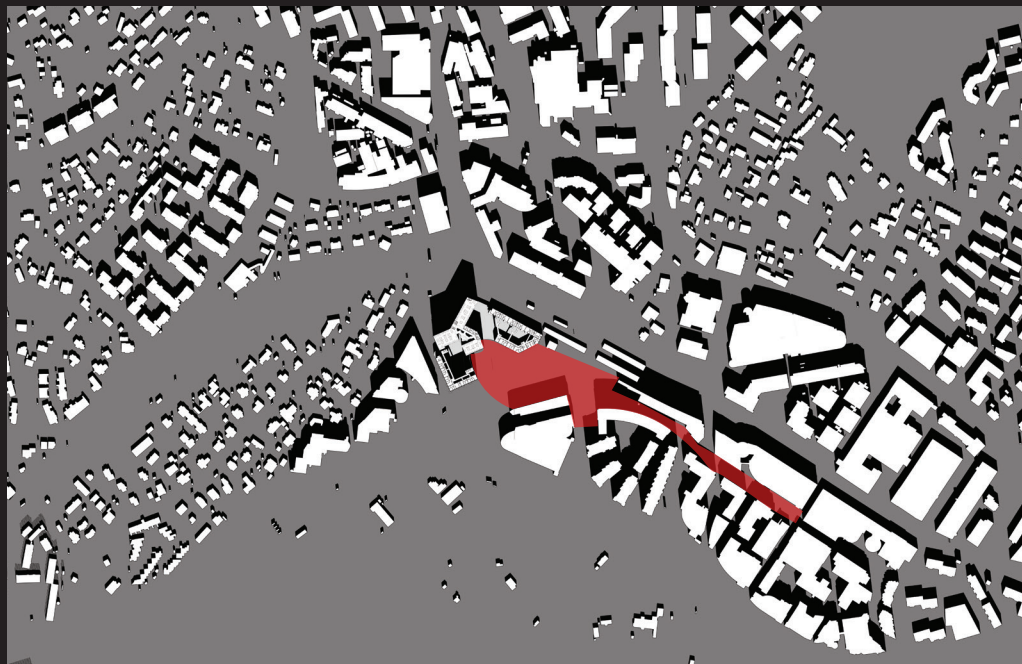
location Skøyen, Oslo, Norway

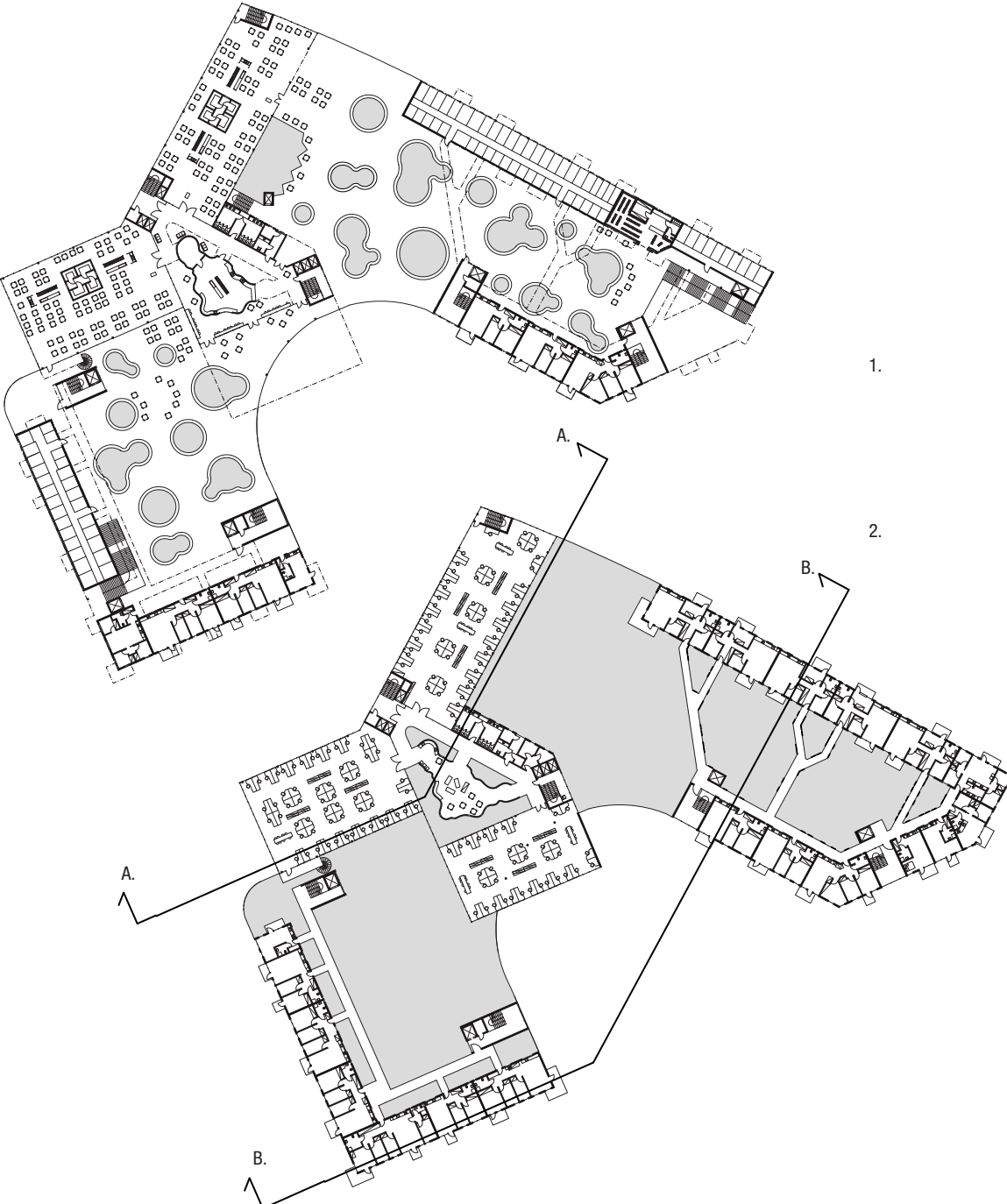
program residential, commercial, food court
